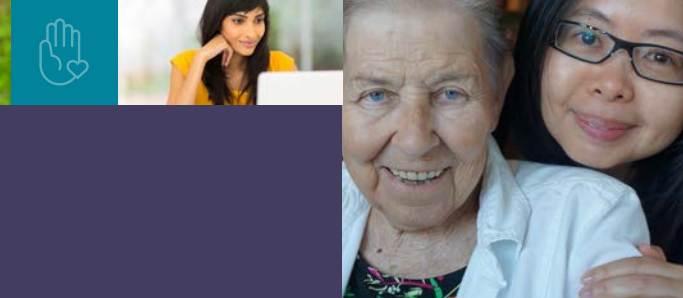

### INFORMATION & VOLUNTEER CENTRE

We take great pride in being Richmond's information & referral specialists. Simply put, if you have a question about a community service, we'll have an answer. We also maintain an online community services directory and, at our office, a vast library of brochures.

On the volunteer side of things, our website is home to Richmond's largest volunteer opportunities database. If that's a bit daunting, we encourage you to schedule a free Volunteer Match appointment. You'll meet one-on-one with a trained Volunteer Advisor, who will help you find a position that suits your skills, interests, and availability.

### LEADERSHIP RICHMOND

Our Leadership Richmond program consists of three modules: Youth Now, Richmond Caring Companies, and Community. The modules, respectively, promote youth leadership, corporate social engagement, and non-profit professional development. Collectively, they help build community capacity and strengthen Richmond's voluntary sector.

### RICHMOND CHILD CARE RESOURCE & REFERRAL CENTRE

For parents, the CCRR provides free child care referrals, drop-in programs, and resources on choosing quality child care. For child care providers, the CCRR offers workshops and training, networking opportunities, and ongoing support. Accessible to both parents and care providers (for a small fee) is the CCRR's early learning lending library, featuring books, theme boxes, activity kits, and more.

### RICHMOND CHRISTMAS FUND

Each year, with incredible support from the community, the Richmond Christmas Fund brightens the holidays for families in need.

### RICHMOND COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Alas, money doesn't grow on trees, so the Community Foundation grows forever funds instead. Once established, usually by an individual, community group, or business, anyone can contribute to a forever fund. When the funds earn investment income, the Foundation distributes a percentage back into the community, as grants to local non-profit organizations and scholarships to Richmond students.

### SENIORS COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

RCRG is dedicated to creating a caring community for seniors, one where they can remain independent for as long as possible. To achieve that goal, we offer a range of services for older adults, including grocery shopping, information & referral, senior peer counselling, and, through the Richmond Better at Home program, transportation, friendly visiting, and light housekeeping.
